The members of our Eco School Club have had a successful year. They were delighted to receive a Highly Commended in the Best Kept School Award. They also organised our Walk to School Week earlier this term which proved to be very popular.

At Carniny we would encourage more children to walk to and from school or partway.

The benefits of walking include:

- Developing safe road awareness in time for independent walking as a teenager
- Improvement in a child's concentration, making it easier to focus in class.
- Creating good habits for an active life as an adult
- Engaging with peers socially as they walk together
- Saving the environment If we all swapped one car journey a week for walking, car traffic levels would reduce by at least 10%.

By encouraging children to walk all, or part of the journey, to and from school it will not only be beneficial from a health perspective but also alleviate some of the parking issues we are experiencing at Carniny PS.

Between now and the end of term why not make a special effort to change old habits and give your children the opportunity to walk a greater distance to school.

Eco School Club - Parking

Children have observed some cars parking on the pavements and close to driveways making it difficult for them to proceed safely and for local residents to access their properties. Child Protection Volunteers

In accordance with the school's Child Protection Policy I ask all parents who would be interested in assisting voluntarily in any aspect of school life during 2016/2017 academic year (PTA, Transport, Library, School Visits etc.) to complete the on line Access NI form before the end of term. Before beginning the on line application you will require an instruction form including a PIN number. This can be obtained from the school office. On completion of the on line form you will receive a Unique Access NI Number which should be brought into school with ID documents for verification. This procedure must be repeated annually.

All items of Lost Property will be on display in the school corridor on Friday 24 June (8.45-11am).


All personal belongings (clothes, footwear etc) left in school at the end of term will be given to charity.
